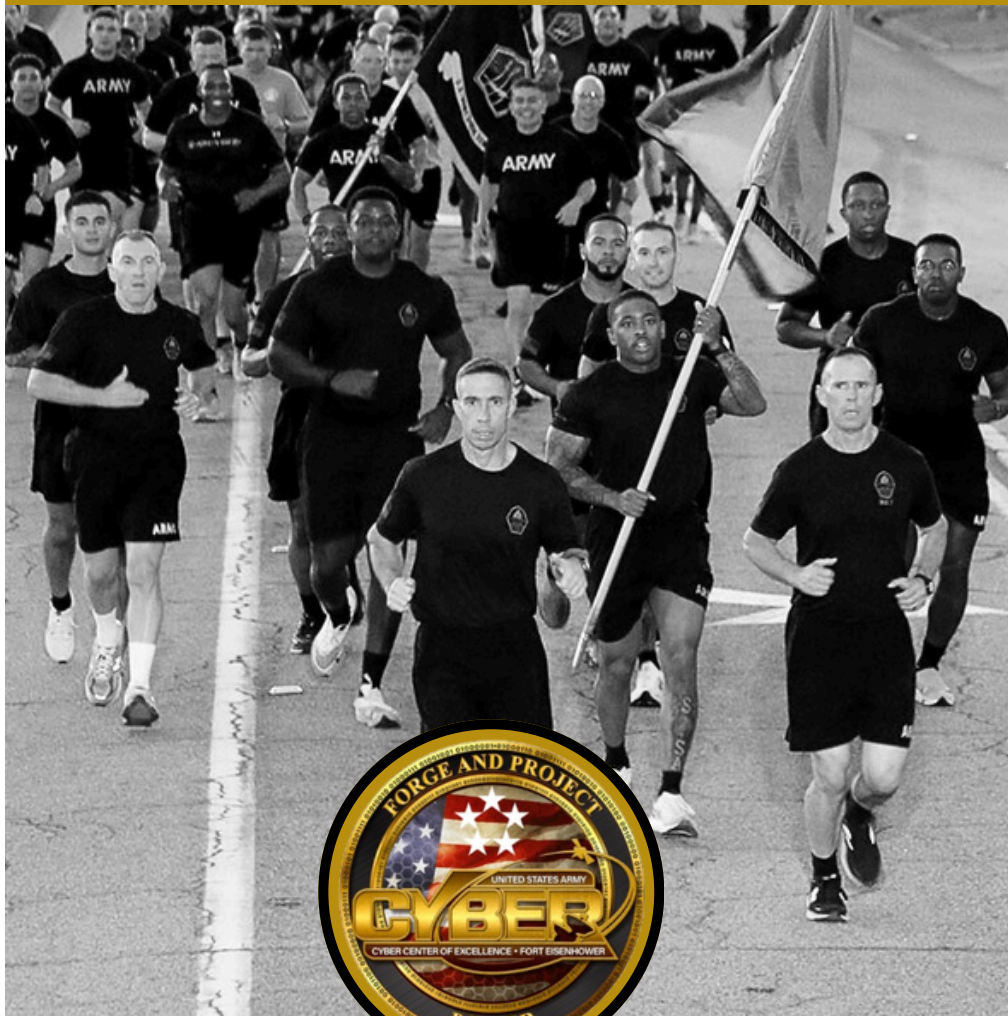

# PRESIDING OFFICER



LIEUTENANT GENERAL MILFORD H. BEAGLE, JR.



Lieutenant General Milford “Beags” Beagle, Jr. is the Commanding General, U.S. Army Combined Arms Center and Fort Leavenworth, Kansas; Commandant, U.S. Army Command and General Staff College; and Deputy Commanding General for Combined Arms, U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command.

LTG Beagle was commissioned as an Infantry Officer upon graduation from South Carolina State University in 1990 as a distinguished military graduate.

LTG Beagle holds master’s degrees from Kansas State University, Manhattan, Kan., and the U.S. Army School of Advanced Military Studies (SAMS), Fort Leavenworth, Kan. LTG Beagle has served in multiple leadership capacities from the platoon to division level. He has served in combat in both Iraq and Afghanistan in positions ranging from operations officer in tactical combat units to Advisor as part of NATO missions.

His career assignments have spanned the globe from Hawaii to the Republic of South Korea. His most recent assignments were as the Commanding General, 10th Mountain Division (Light Infantry) and Fort Drum, N.Y., prior to that he served as the Commanding General, U.S. Army Training Center and Fort Jackson, S.C. LTG Beagle also served as the Executive Officer to the 35th Vice Chief of Staff of the Army, General Daniel Allyn, followed by serving as the Deputy Commanding General (Support), 10th Mountain Division (Light), Fort Drum, N.Y., and forward deployed in support of OPERATION INHERENT RESOLVE, Kuwait.

LTG Beagle and his wife Pamela have two children, Jordan (Valencia) and Jayden, and two grandchildren.

## OUTGOING COMMANDING GENERAL



### MAJOR GENERAL PAUL T. STANTON



Major General Paul T. Stanton assumed duties as the Commanding General, U.S. Army Cyber Center of Excellence and (then) Fort Gordon on June 30, 2021, after serving as the Deputy Commanding General (Operations), U.S. Army Cyber Command.

He graduated from the U.S. Military Academy at West Point in 1995 and commissioned into the Infantry. He transitioned to the Cyber Branch in 2015.

During his career, MG Stanton has served in a number of command, staff, and joint positions, including service as Platoon Leader and later Battalion Personnel Officer, 1-508th Infantry Airborne Battalion Combat Team in Vicenza, Italy; Platoon Leader and later Operations Officer, 1st Battalion, 26th Infantry in Schweinfurt, Germany; Assistant Operations Officer, 1-502nd Infantry at Fort Campbell, Ky.; Commander, B Company, 1-502nd Infantry at Fort Campbell, Ky. and OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM in Iraq; Instructor (Computer Science) at the U.S. Military Academy at West Point, N.Y.; Senior Technical Advisor, U.S. Army Cyber Command at Fort Meade, Md.; National Security Agency fellow at Fort Meade; Director, Capabilities Development Group, U.S. Cyber Command at Fort Meade; Commander, U.S. Army Cyber Protection Brigade at (then) Fort Gordon, Ga.; and Deputy Director of Operations (J-3) U.S. Cyber Command at Fort Meade.

MG Stanton has completed two operational assignments: Instructor, Combined Security Transition Command-Afghanistan in OPERATION ENDURING FREEDOM; and as Commander, B Company, 1-502nd Infantry, 101st Airborne Division in OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM.

He has earned three degrees in Computer Science: a bachelor's degree from the U.S. Military Academy at West Point, a master's degree from the University of Illinois, and a doctorate (PhD) from Johns Hopkins University.

His military education includes the Infantry Officer Basic and Advanced Courses, the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College, and a Senior Service College Fellowship.

His awards and decorations are typical of an officer of his rank and time in service. He is married to the former Nomi Harris and together they have three children, Hannah, Charlotte, and Toby.

## INCOMING COMMANDING GENERAL



### MAJOR GENERAL RYAN M. JANOVIC



MG Ryan M. Janovic is the 42nd Commanding General, U.S. Army Cyber Center of Excellence and Fort Eisenhower.

A native of Akron, Ohio, MG Janovic graduated from the U.S. Military Academy at West Point in 1993 and commissioned into the Military Intelligence Corps. He began his career as a platoon leader in the 201st Military Intelligence Battalion, 513th Military Intelligence Brigade at (then) Fort Gordon, Georgia.

He served as the Brigade Intelligence Officer for the 1st Brigade, 2nd Infantry Division in the Republic of Korea. Following Command and General Staff College, he served in Baghdad, Iraq as an aide-de-camp and Deputy Executive Officer within the headquarters of Multi-National Forces - Iraq. In 2005, he served as both a Battalion and Brigade Operations Officer with the 902d MI Group. After spending a year as a White House Fellow, he trained and deployed with the Special Troops Battalion of 3rd Brigade, 1st Infantry Division to eastern Afghanistan.

A distinguished graduate of the National War College, MG Janovic next led the Army G2 Director's Initiative Group before reporting to (then) Fort Hood to assume command of the 504th Battlefield Surveillance Brigade. After brigade command, he served as the U.S. Army Forces Command Deputy Chief of Staff for Intelligence (G2) and Executive Officer to the Commanding General; later the Executive Officer to the Commander United Nations Command/Combined Forces Command/U.S. Forces Korea.

In 2019, he joined the cyber ranks as the Deputy Commander of Joint Force Headquarters – Cyber (Army). His last assignment was Director of Operations (J3) for U.S. Cyber Command at Fort Meade, Md. MG Janovic will assume command as the 42nd Commanding General of the Cyber Center of Excellence and Fort Eisenhower, Ga.

MG Janovic is married to the former Shannon Lea Howard of Greenville, N.C. and they are parents of an 11th grade scholar-athlete. They are happy to be part of the Augusta community for over five years.

# UNIT HISTORY



## U.S. ARMY CYBER CENTER OF EXCELLENCE

The U.S. Army completed its Operation STEADFAST reform effort on July 1, 1973, with the simultaneous establishment of the U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command (TRADOC); the U.S. Army Forces Command (FORSCOM) from the former U.S. Army Continental Army Command (CONARC), and the U.S. Army Combat Developments Command (CDC). At the time, TRADOC commanded 24 schools, two of which were signal.

On 1 July 1974, the signal schools were relocated to (then) Fort Gordon, and the Army Signal Center of Excellence (SCoE) was born. The SCoE now governed the official U.S. Army Signal School. On Oct. 31, 1976, the Army integrated its Communications / Electronics School with the Signal School making the SCoE the premier Signal training and education installation.

In October of 2010, the Department of Defense established the Army Cyber Command. In February 2013, the 38th Army Chief of Staff, General Raymond Odierno, approved General Robert Cone, Commanding General, TRADOC, to formally create the U.S. Army Cyber School and respective military occupational specialties. Since Signal and Cyber share many commonalities and both emphasize force modernization through communication, (then) Fort Gordon was once again chosen to house another cutting-edge training facility.

Due to the technological advancements of Cyber warfare, the Army decided in January 2014, to transition the Signal Center of Excellence to the Cyber Center of Excellence (CCoE) to better reflect the Army's modernization efforts. Under a two-star command, the CCoE now governs both Signal and Cyber Schools including Electromagnetic Warfare (EW) training.

On August 4th, 2014, the U.S. Army Cyber School was unveiled by CCoE Commander Major General Lawarren Patterson and Colonel Jennifer Buckner, the first Cyber School Commandant. On September 1st, 2014, The Army officially established the Cyber Branch. On October 27th, 2023, Fort Gordon was officially redesignated as Fort Eisenhower.
