SUBJECT: Commanding General's Policy Memorandum No. 16 Uniform and Appearance Policy

1. REFERENCES:

- a. Army Regulation 670-1, Wear and Appearance of Army Uniforms and Insignia Rapid Action Revision (RAR) Issue Date: 10 April 2015
- b. Marine Corps Order P1020.34G, The Marine Corps Uniform Regulations, 31 March 2003
- c. United States Navy Uniform Regulations, NAVADMIN, Navy Uniform Board Update, 2 June 2012
- d. Air Force Instruction 36-2903, Dress and Personal Appearance of Air Force Personnel, 2 August 2011

2. APPLICABILITY. This policy is applicable in its entirety to all service members who are assigned, attached, mobilized, demobilizing, or in training at Fort Gordon. Paragraph b. applies to all civilians that enter the installation.

3. POLICY.

a. Duty Uniform:

(1) Military personnel will wear the prescribed uniform of the day as directed by the unit commander. When the Military uniform is worn, it will be complete and worn properly at all times regardless of duty status on and off the installation. The uniform will not be altered in such a way to change the intended appearance or function as designed.

(2) Headgear will be worn at all times while outdoors and when operating a military vehicle of any type unless it would interfere with the operation of the vehicle. Service members may remove their headgear while in a privately owned vehicle.

(3) ACUs, OCP, or the equivalent duty uniform will be worn while conducting official military business (In- or Out- Processing, etc.).

(4) Civilian clothing is not authorized for service members in any formation or fitness facility during normal PT hours. The PT uniform is the only authorized uniform.

(5) Physical Fitness uniforms are authorized for wear in any facilities or activities on Fort Gordon provided the uniform is clean. Soldiers may wear earpieces (headphones or ear buds) in APFU while exercising indoors. Color and functional design (belt versus vest) of the PT belt is at the discretion of Commanders at the Brigade or independent Battalion level.

(6) Regardless of the uniform, appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE), (e.g. helmets and safety gear) will be worn when operating a bicycle or motorcycle. Personnel will remove PPE and don authorized headgear upon dismounting.

b. Prohibited Attire:

(1) Clothing that is ripped, torn, dirty or foul.


(2) Clothing with printing, insignia or pictures which are sexual, violent, offensive, obscene or suggestive in nature; promote illegal activities; depict derogatory social, religious, racial or ethnic messages; or present an impression contrary to the good order and discipline of the Armed Forces and the Military community. This includes but is not limited to, gang affiliated, extremist group, or other hate-inciting dress.

(3) Clothing which exposes the breasts, buttocks, or underwear.

(4) Tank tops/sleeveless shirts with excessive arm openings (from shoulder to waist) are not authorized for wear outside of athletic activities.

(5) Bare chest or bare feet in public areas except for designated swimming, sunbathing, and recreational areas. Bathing suits are not authorized for wear as an outer garment in public areas except areas designated for swimming.
